

## Funeral At Chelsea For James Iezek

James Iezek, 84, Brooklyn farmer for many years, died last Friday in the Pleasant Oak nursing home in Tama where he had lived for the past 18 months.

Funeral services were held Monday at 9:30 a.m. in St. Joseph's church at Chelsea. Interment was in St. Joseph's cemetery at Chelsea with the following serving as pallbearers: James Manatt, John Bennett, William McGarry, Emil Behounek, Maurice Van Hamme and Sylvester Prusha.

The son of Thomas and Anna Benda Iezek, James Iezek was born Oct. 27, 1880, at Brooklyn and died Sept. 10, 1965.

He was married to Agnes Behounek Sept. 28, 1904, and three sons were born to the couple: Fred and Edwin of Brooklyn and Henry, who died in infancy. Mr. Iezek had lived his entire life on a farm north of Brooklyn with the exception of the time he lived in the nursing home.

In addition to his two sons, he leaves six grandchildren; two sisters, Mrs. Anna Bennett and Mrs. Mary Behounek of Chelsea, and two brothers, Albert Iezek of Hartwick and Thomas Iezek of Belle Plaine.

He was preceded in death by his wife, son and three brothers, John, Charles and Joe.
