

Harlan R. Inman Dies At Home

Harlan R. Inman, 65, lifelong resident of Grinnell, died suddenly Tuesday evening at his home at 1027 West Street.

Funeral services will be held Friday at 2 p.m. at the James-Schalinske Funeral Home. Dr. G. S. Bruland of the Methodist church and Rev. C. E. Kingsley of the First Baptist church will officiate.

On September 8, 1923, he was married to Nellie J. Furber at Montezuma. Mr. Inman was a member of the Odd Fellows lodge and the Fidelity Encampment. He served for the past nine years as Grand Treasurer of the Encampment for the state of Iowa. He also served in the U. S. Army during World War I with the field artillery.
