

Mr. Jackson rites today

Donald F. Jackson, 65, of 1612 Washington Ave., Des Moines, died suddenly Sunday evening, Jan. 26, in Des Moines.

The son of William M. and Margaret Swanson Jackson, he was born Dec. 8, 1909, near Grinnell. He attended rural schools near Grinnell and Oskaloosa and was graduated from Oskaloosa High School. He attended Iowa State University in Ames.

He was married to Myrtle Irene Garr on Feb. 10, 1937, in Ottumwa. They moved to Des Moines in 1940. Mr. Jackson was a member of the United Methodist Church and the Fraternal Order of Eagles. He had been associated with Ruan Transportation in Des Moines for 25 years as an ambulance and taxi driver.

Survivors include his wife, Myrtle; two children, Robert Patrick of Grinnell and Mrs. Ray (Nancy) Ramsay of Ft. Worth, Tex.; two grandchildren; and two brothers, Mack Jackson of Rose Hill and Keith Jackson of Omaha, Neb. He was preceded in death by his parents and one sister, Wilma Hope Jackson, who died in infancy.

Funeral services for Donald F. Jackson were held at 1:30 p.m. today (Thursday) at the Smith Funeral Home, with the Rev. John W. McCallum, pastor of the Grinnell United Methodist Church, officiating.
