

## Fay Jackson

Fay Donovan Jackson, 85, of the Rock Creek Lake area died Thursday, June 16, at Iowa Methodist Medical Center in Des Moines.

Funeral services were conducted Saturday at the Smith Funeral Home, with the Rev. John Epperson, pastor of the Grinnell Christian Church, officiating. He had a jewelry shop at the base of the elevated train station in Evanston, Ill., and was in business for many years until fire destroyed the shop. He then worked for a landscaping business and, later, for the Winnetka School District. Following his retirement he moved to a farm near Rock Creek in 1978.

Surviving are three sisters, Beulah Kent of South Gate, Calif., Faith Barr of Denver, Colo., and Wilma Oaks of Bakersfield, Calif. He was preceded in death by his parents and two brothers, Claire and Harold.
