Mrs. Ada Valleau
Nov 1928 Jacobs Passes

Many friends were saddened yesterday by word of the passing of Mrs. Ada Valleau Jacobs in a hospital in Chicago. Mrs. Jacobs had been in a critical condition following an operation performed about two weeks ago.

Ada Valleau came to Grinnell as a little girl from Sunbora, Ia. She was a light-hearted, fun-loving girl, a splendid woman, dear to all who knew her.

Since her marriage to Mr. Cliff Jacobs her home has been in Chicago, where her husband is engaged in business. Mr. Jacobs and their one little girl, Angie Jacobs, survive her, also her two sons by former marriage, Elbert W. Clark and Henry Clark. Elbert is married, and his child is the one grandchild.

Mrs. Jacobs is also survived by her mother, Mrs. Angie Valleau, formerly of Grinnell, now of Los Angeles, one sister, Mrs. Sam Brainard, of Los Angeles and one brother, Frank Valleau, of Kansas City.

Something like two weeks ago Mrs. Jacobs was taken ill and went to Grant Memorial Hospital in Chicago where she underwent an operation for appendicitis. Complications developed which resulted in her death. Her illness was brief but her suffering was intense.

Friends have not been informed as to where Mrs. Jacobs will be buried, but presumably on her husband's family lot in Chicago.

A letter from a friend in Chicago gives The Herald additional particulars regarding the death of Mrs. Ada Valleau Jacobs in Chicago on Wednesday, Nov. 21.

Mrs. Jacobs underwent an operation for appendicitis and peritonitis on Nov. 4. The operation was successful and she seemed to be holding her own for a time. A sudden turn for the worse came on Sunday, Nov. 13 and although she rallied and was bright and cheerful all day the 21st, a sinking spell occurred late in the afternoon and she passed away. Her death is mourned by a wide circle of friends in Chicago and Grinnell.

Mrs. Jacobs was born in Sunbora, Iowa, and was educated in the schools of that place and Grinnell College. She was a member of the class of 1904 but did not graduate. She was married in 1904 in Grinnell, where her mother, Mrs. Angie Valleau, had been living with her daughters and son, to Elbert W. Clark, Jr. They had two sons, Elbert Warren Clark III and Henry Brainard Clark. Mr. Clark died Oct. 26, 1917 and she was married in 1918 to Clifton B. Jacobs of Chicago. They have one child, a daughter, Angie.

She was a devoted wife and mother and had hosts of friends, both in Iowa and Chicago and especially in the north shore suburb of Hubbard Woods, where the family has resided for several years.

Elbert Clark is married and has a son who is the fourth to bear the characteristic family name. He is Elbert Warren Clark IV.

Mrs. Jacobs leaves to mourn her loss her husband, two sons, Elbert and Henry, her little daughter Angie, her mother, Mrs. Angie Valleau, her sister Emma, Mrs. Samuel Brainard of Beverly Hills, Calif., and her brother Frank Valleau, of Kansas City, Mo.
