Addie M. Stevens-Janes

Word was received Tuesday of the death in Chicago early Tuesday of Mrs. Addie M. Stevens-Janes, a former resident of Montour, and a graduate of Grinnell College in 1883. Mrs. Janes' death followed an operation for a cancer, from which she had suffered several years. Addie Stevens entered Iowa College in 1879 as a member of the class of 1882, ladies' course, but afterwards decided to complete the scientific course and graduated with the class of 1883. She was a bright and scholarly young woman, universally liked, and graduated with high rank.

After graduation she was united in marriage with Chas. H. Janes, then in business here, a member of the firm of Hammond Bros. & Janes. Mr. and Mrs. Janes afterward went to Portland, Oregon, where he worked in several large firms in Portland and later to Chicago. While in Chicago Mrs. Janes became an active member of the P. E. O. and served in many capacities and afterward became an officer of the national organization. Her father, C. J. Stevens, of Montour, Ill. Mrs. Stevens' husband has leaves one son, Raymond, chief of bureau, Alaska. Burial takes place today at Montour.

In the death of Mrs. Janes, Grinnell College loses one of its most capable graduates.
