

Newton Crash Claims Life Of Kellogg Man

William Janeway Dies
Thursday As Truck Hits
Car; Wife Hospitalized

A 76-year-old Kellogg man, William J. Janeway became Jasper county's third traffic fatality of 1937 Thursday when the car in which he was riding was struck by a truck.

The fatal accident took place near the east city limits of Newton on Highway 6 about noon on Thursday. Janeway was a passenger in an auto driven by his wife Lillian, 77. Mrs. Janeway was attempting to turn into the driveway of a supermarket when the car and truck collided.

Although hospitalized with a shoulder fracture and cuts and bruises, Mrs. Janeway was not considered to be in serious condition. Her husband was dead on arrival at a Newton hospital.

Driver of the truck, an empty west-bound semi-trailer, was 33-year-old Vilas A. Walton of Hubbard.

Janeway had lived in Jasper county all of his life and was a retired farmer. In addition to his wife, he is survived by two daughters and four grandchildren.

Other survivors include three brothers and four sisters.

Funeral services were held Saturday, Feb. 9th at the Kellogg Methodist church. The Rev. Grace Anderson, former pastor of that church now of Cambridge, officiated, and was assisted by the Rev. Floyd Newbrough of the Kellogg church.

Interment was at the Center Friends church.
