Ida B. Johnson Services Held

Ida Beatrice Johnson, 67, of Lynnville passed away Sept. 21 at Grinnell General Hospital West.

The daughter of John O. and Jane Main Fleener, she was born near Searsboro on July 18, 1902. She attended the rural school near her home, and in 1921 graduated from Grinnell High School. She then attended State Teachers College at Cedar Falls, State Teachers College at Greeley, Colo., and Drake University.

She entered the teaching profession after graduation, teaching at Brooklyn, Searsboro, Lynnville-Sully, Knoxville and, for 20 years, Fort Dodge.

On June 24, 1950, she was married to Fred Johnson at the Friends Church, Searsboro. The couple lived on the farm of her childhood west of Searsboro, where they remained until moving again to Lynnville. Following her retirement, she continued to do substitute teaching and tutoring.

Mrs. Johnson was a member of Lynnville Friends Church, president of U.S.F.W., a member of the W.C.T.U. and the Garden Club.

She is survived by five sisters, Ethyl Poots of Grinnell, Susie Longaker of New Sharon, Elizabeth Davidson of Grinnell, Della De Vries of New Sharon and Ruth Gertsma of Lynnville; a brother, Clifford Fleener of San Jacinto, Calif.; and several nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by two sisters, Nellie Arment of Montour and Daisy Holmes of Grinnell, and a brother, Arthur Fleener of Grinnell.

Services for Mrs. Johnson were

held at 2 p.m. Tuesday, Sept. 23, at the Lynnville Friends Church, with the Rev. Delano Cunningham, pastor of the church, officiating. Ross Ratchiff, vocalist, and Harriet Macy, accompanist, provided the music.
