Mrs. Violet Jones, 84, of Brooklyn, died Saturday night, Dec. 12 in Brookhaven Nursing Home, Brooklyn.

Funeral services for Mrs. Jones were held at 1:30 p.m., Tuesday, Dec. 15 in the Grace United Methodist Church, Brooklyn. Rev. Kalen K. Fristad officiated.
