**Mrs. Geo. Kelley,
Dies This Morning;
Wednesday Rites**

Mrs. Agnetta F. Kelley, age 66, wife of George Kelley of 833 High St., Grinnell, died early this morning (Monday) at a local hospital following a serious illness since 1960.

Funeral services will be held at 10:00 a.m., Wednesday at the Grinnell Methodist church with the Rev. Chester Custer and the Rev. George Richter, officiating. Music will be provided by Mrs. Willard Heffner at the organ and Mrs. Noel Taylor, vocalist. Assisting with the flowers will be Miss Judy Kinnaird and Mrs. Roger Moyer.

She was born January 7, 1898, at Wesley, Iowa, the daughter of Marne Anderson and Halvor Halvorson Flom. She attended the local schools of Wesley, and graduated from Wesley High School. Later, she graduated in 1922 from Morningside College, at Sioux City, with a Bachelor of Arts degree.

On June 5, 1924, she was united in marriage with George Bruce Kelley at Carroll, Iowa, and to this union was born one son, who died in infancy. Mr. and Mrs. Kelley had lived in Minneapolis and Kansas before moving to Grinnell in 1931 to make their home.

Mrs. Kelley had taught mathematics in various Iowa high schools for the last 25 years before retiring in January of 1964. She was a member of the Grinnell Methodist church and Chapter No. 47 of the Order of Eastern Star of which she was Past Matron. She also had been a member of the White Shrine of Jerusalem.

Surviving besides her husband, George, are two brothers, Halvor Flom of Wesley, and Harold Flom of Landsford, North Dakota; and two sisters, Miss Gunhild Flom of Wesley and Miss Signe Flom of Fort Dodge.

She was preceded in death by her parents and three brothers.
