Mrs. Kincaid services held

Elizabeth E. Kincaid, 93, a native of rural Montezuma, died Friday, July 10, at Friendship Manor where she had lived since 1981.

Funeral services were conducted at 2 p.m. Monday at the Smith Funeral Home, with the Rev. Raymond C. Lott of the Grinnell United Methodist Church officiating. Organist was Betty Ann Battey. Burial was in the Masonic-Odd Fellows Cemetery in Montezuma. Memorials may be left at the funeral home.

The daughter of James Albert and Sarah Elizabeth Gorsuch Bangham, she was born southeast of Montezuma on Oct. 25, 1893. She graduated from Grinnell High School and later received her teaching certificate from Ohio State University. She taught elementary students in the

Washington No. 1 and Grant No. 5 rural schools.

On Dec. 23, 1919, she was married to Orson Arthur Kincaid at her parents' home in Grinnell. The couple lived briefly in Syracuse, N.Y., moving to Columbus, Ohio, in 1920. She lived in Columbus for 61 years, coming to Friendship Manor in 1981.

While in Columbus, Mrs. Kincaid was a member of the Clintonville and Columbus Women's Club, the Salvation Army, and the North Broadway United Methodist Church.

She was preceded in death by her husband in 1963. There are no immediate survivors, although a number of nieces and nephews live in the Grinnell area. She was also preceded by one sister, Ida McNally, and three brothers, Fred, Ernest and James Bangham.
