Emmet A. Klyn, 77, of Lynnville died Friday, Oct. 16, 1998 at Iowa Methodist Medical Center in Des Moines.

Funeral services were Tuesday, Oct. 20 at the Lynnville Friends Church with the Rev. Marvin Miller officiating.

Interment followed in Sully Cemetery.

Mr. Klyn was born May 15, 1921 north of Kilduff, the son of Henry and Lena Nora Briggs Klyn. He was raised in the Sully and Kilduff areas and graduated from Lynnville High School in 1938. He farmed with his father in the Lynnville area for several years.

On January 7, 1942, he married Esther Talbot, northwest of Lynnville. They later moved to a farm east of Searsboro where Mr. Klyn continued farming with his father and brother.

The Klyns eventually moved to their acreage just west of Searsboro where Mr. Klyn raised exotic animals. It was during this time that he was working at the Searsboro elevator. He retired in 1983.

A Lynnville resident since 1996, Mr. Klyn was a member and former trustee of the Lynnville Friends Church, a former leader of the Sugar Creek Mountaineers 4-H Club for more than 20 years, sheen superintendent

was also a member of the Searsboro City Council and Searsboro School Board.

Mr. Klyn also showed horses on a regular basis, was an avid hunter and fisherman and was a member of the Lynnville Friends Cemetery Board.
