Louverna May Koger, 86, of 1221 West St., Grinnell, died early Monday at the home of her niece, Mrs. Dale (Ruthe) Clark, with whom she had made her home for 29 years.

Funeral services for Miss Koger were held at 1:30 p.m. Wednesday at the Smith Funeral Home, with Elder Vernon Hopkins of the Primitive Baptist Church of Ferris, Ill., officiating.
