Funeral services for Mrs. Laura Korn, 77, of Hartwick, were held at 10:30 a.m. Saturday, in the Congregational Church, Hartwick. Mrs. Korn died Wednesday, Nov. 6, 1986, in the Brookhaven Nursing Home, Brooklyn.

Laura Charlotte Franklin Korn, daughter of Willard and Angeline McKinley Franklin, was born May 9, 1909, in Williamsport, Ind. She moved with her family to Vinton, Ia., when three years of age. Mrs. Korn graduated from the Vinton High School and attended Iowa State Normal School, Cedar Falls, for two years. She then taught in the Hartwick School for five years. On March 10, 1934, she was united in marriage to John Calvin Korn, in the Little Brown Church, Nashua. They lived in the Hartwick area.

Mrs. Korn was a member of the Congregational Church, Hartwick, where she was a member of the choir, served as missionary correspondent, and was a member of the Women's Fellowship and Quilting. Mrs. Korn was a member of the Victor Social Club, the DAR and Farm Bureau. She was a 4-H leader, worked for the election board for years, and was affiliated with Winslow Cemetery group.

Surviving are two sons and their wives, William and Janet Korn and Dennis and Linda Korn, all of Brooklyn; two daughters, Kathryn Korn of Trenton, Mich., and Sharon and her husband, John McIntosh of Marion; one brother, William Franklin of Marina Del Ray, Calif.; one sister, Sylvia, Mrs. James Knupp of Ft.
