Mrs. Mildred M. Korn, 86, of Brooklyn, died Tuesday, Oct. 4, 1988, in the Brookhaven Nursing Home, Brooklyn, following a short illness.

Funeral services were held at 1:30 p.m., Thursday, Oct. 6, in the Nevenhoven Funeral Home, Brooklyn. Rev. G. H. Hulsebus of Montezuma officiated. The organist was Mrs. Nina Bartachek.
