

## Milo Kruseman

Milo G. Kruseman, 82, a resident of St. Francis Manor, formerly of Sully, died Sunday, June 29, at the manor.

Funeral services were conducted Wednesday at the Sully Community Church, with Milo Vande Krol officiating. Casket bearers were his grandsons, and burial was in Sully Cemetery, with the Van Dyk-Duven Funeral Home of Pella in charge of arrangements.

He was the son of Everett C. and Christina Boat Kruseman and was born Aug. 25, 1914, south of Sully. He attended rural school, then began farming with his father.

He was married to Vera Van Wyk March 2, 1938, in Sully. After farming for 40 years, they retired and moved to Sully. Mr. Kruseman started several businesses, including Kruseman Welding and Repair, Kruseman Implement, Kruseman Fertilizer, Kruseman Construction and Kruseman Feed and Grain.

He became a resident of St. Francis Manor in 1988.

Surviving are four daughters, Jenice Van Rees of Sully, Joyce MacKenzie of Ankeny, Julia Hay of Sully and Jean Van Der Kamp of Sully; 15 grandchildren; 15 great-grandchildren; and two sisters, Maxine Northcutt of Sully and Mildred Stanley of Searsboro.
