Lillian Lamb memorial held (Kenneth)

Lillian Gifford Lamb, 90, of the Mayflower Home died Sunday evening, Dec. 8, at Grinnell General Hospital.

A memorial service was held at 10 a.m. Wednesday in Denison Chapel of the Mayflower Home, with the Rev. Philip J. Ramstad, pastor of the United Church of Christ-Congregational, officiating. Deanna Acrea was pianist.

Lillian Gifford was born on July 30, 1895, at Ashland, Wis. She attended schools in Des Moines, Cedar Rapids, Minneapolis, Minn., and Milwaukee, Wis. She then attended Coe College and graduated from Milwaukee Downer College.

After graduation she was girls' worker and financial secretary at Plymouth Congregational Church in Milwaukee, then taught Latin in Cedar Rapids. She was married to Kenneth

E. Lamb in 1924. They lived in Milwaukee and Beloit, Wis., where she was successively employment manager for Schuster's Store and a Girl Scout executive director for three Wisconsin counties. Mr. Lamb died in 1955.

After retiring from Girl Scout work, Mrs. Lamb moved to Cedar Rapids where she was a bookkeeper for a large law firm. She moved to the Mayflower Home in 1977.

Mrs. Lamb was a member of the United Church of Christ-Congregational, the Retired Teachers Association, the United Nations Association and the League of Women Voters.

She is survived by a daughter, Margaret Hebb of Rockton, Ill.; one son, Kenneth Lamb of Ironwood, Mich.; three grandchildren; and a sister, Mrs. Art Beurle of Cedar Rapids.
