Linda Margaret Lannom, 36, the wife of Sharp Lannom IV of 904 High St., Grinnell, died at her home late Saturday afternoon (Sept. 28).

Officials ruled the death a suicide.

The daughter of George and Helen Wallace Hackett, she was born Feb. 11, 1938, in Detroit, Mich. Following her graduation from the University of Michigan in 1960, she was an elementary school teacher.

On Aug. 4, 1962, she was married to Sharp Lannom IV in Dearborn, Mich. The couple had three daughters, Sarah, 9; Catherine, 7; and Martha, 4. She and her husband had lived in Grinnell since their marriage.

While in college, she was a member of Collegiate Sorosis sorority. Mrs. Lannom had a continuing interest in art and education. She assisted in establishing the Community Art Association and did volunteer work at the Congregational church preschool.

Survivors include her husband; her three daughters; her parents, Mr. and Mrs. George Hackett of Dearborn; and her brother, Stephen Hackett of Centerville, Ohio.
