Pauline Laverman, 68, of rural Killduff, a native of the Sully area, died Sunday, June 8, at Pella Regional Health Center.

Funeral services were conducted Wednesday at the Sully Christian Reformed Church, with the Rev. Lawrence Howerzyl officiating. Burial was in Sully Cemetery, with the Van Dyk-Duven Funeral Home of Pella in charge of arrangements.

She was the daughter of Marcelis and Annie Baarda Nikkel and was born Nov. 15, 1928, west of Sully. She completed eighth grade at Sully Christian Grade School.

On Sept. 20, 1949, she was married to Clarence Roy Laverman at her parents' farm home. The couple lived west of Galesburg for 18 years until moving to rural Newton. They had lived west of Killduff for the past 11 years. Mrs. Laverman did housecleaning for several families until her health failed in 1991.
