

## Karl Lindenmayer rites held

Karl Lindenmayer, 83, of 530 Tenth Ave., Grinnell, died Monday, Aug. 19, at Grinnell General Hospital.

Funeral services were conducted at 2 p.m. Thursday at the Smith Funeral Home, with the Rev. Philip J. Ramstad, pastor of the United Church of Christ-Congregational, officiating. Organist was Alice Renaud. Burial was in the Brooklyn Cemetery.

The son of F. C. and Augusta Lorenz Lindenmayer, he was born on Sept. 14, 1901, at Marengo. He graduated from Marengo High School and later attended the University of Iowa.

Following his education he worked as a cashier in banks at Iowa City and Des Moines. In 1939 he established the Lindenmayer Market in Grinnell, operating the business until 1945.

He studied law with the Grinnell law firm of Charles M. Manly and was admitted to the Iowa State Bar in 1950. Mr. Lindenmayer practiced law in Grinnell for 35 years.

He was married to Fern Ondler Light on May 2, 1959, in Grinnell. He was a member of the United Church of Christ-Congregational, the Hermon Masonic Lodge No. 273, the Iowa State Bar Association and the Poweshiek County Bar Association.

Surviving are his children, John Lindenmayer of Arvada, Colo., and Karel Plantz of Salt Lake City, Utah; one stepson, Dr. H. R. Light of Grinnell; nine grandchildren; and 10 great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents; his wife, Fern; one grandson; and his brother, E. L. Lindenmayer.
