Former Resident Dies In Montana

Charles Boyd Lineweaver, a former Grinnell resident, passed away last Monday at a hospital in Havre, Montana, at the age of 85.

The deceased was born on December 29, 1876, in Poweshiek County. In 1904, he married Ella Jane McLain of Pleasant Township. His wife preceded him in death on March 3, 1957.

In 1907, Mr. and Mrs. Lineweaver moved to North Dakota and later to Inverness, Montana, where they homesteaded. Mr. Lineweaver retired from farming in 1942, at which time the couple moved to Havre.

Survivors include a son, Lewis, of Havre; a brother of Des Moines; a sister, Mrs. Fannie Johnson of Montezuma; one grandchild, and three great grandchildren.

Funeral services were conducted on Thursday, at 2:00 p. m., at the Holland and Bonine Funeral Home, with the Rev. Malcolm McCullough officiating. Interment was in Sunset Memorial Gardens.

Death Summons Charles Lineweaver

Charles Boyd Lineweaver was born Dec. 29, 1876, in Pleasant township and grew to manhood in the Montezuma area. Feb. 22, 1904 he was united in marriage with Ella Jane McLain and they established a home on a farm near Montezuma. They went to Mohall, N. D., in 1907 and then homesteaded near Inverness, Mont., in 1911 where they farmed until retirement in 1942. Since then they made their home at Havre, Mont., where Mrs. Lineweaver died in 1957.

Funeral services were conducted at 2 p. m. July 5 at a Havre funeral home by the Rev. Malcolm McCullough. William Lisenby played the funeral music and accompanied Mrs. Jack Clark and Mrs. Lloyd Wheeler as they sang "Jesus Is Always There" and "Only A Touch."

Interment was in Sunset Memorial Gardens at Havre with Ed Sutor, Don Anderson, Wm. Livesay, John Pfeifer, Jerry Benbrooks and Loute Hooge as casket bearers.
