Edna Linkletter services held

Edna May Linkletter, 94, of the Mayflower Home died of a heart ailment Sunday afternoon, Sept. 7, at the Mayflower Health Care Center.

Funeral services were conducted at 10:30 a.m. Wednesday at the Smith Funeral Home, with the Rev. Philip J. Ramstad, pastor of the Grinnell United Church of Christ-Congregational, officiating. Organist was Theresa Walker. Graveside services were conducted at 3 p.m. Wednesday at Linwood Cemetery in Cedar Rapids, with the Rev. Robert A. Towner, priest-in-charge of St. Paul's Episcopal Church of Grinnell, officiating.

The daughter of John and Bertha Ramsdell Stamy, she was born on May 23, 1892, in Cedar Rapids. She attended public schools in Cedar Rapids and graduated from Drake University in 1916.

On June 26, 1917, she was married to Isaac E. Linkletter in Cedar Rapids. The couple lived in Winnipeg and Toronto, Canada, where Mr. Linkletter

served as pastor of Disciples of Christ churches. They moved to Cedar Rapids in 1928 and to Winterset in 1948, where Mr. Linkletter served Christian Church pastorates.

Following her husband's death, Mrs. Linkletter taught home economics and English at Garden Grove. She later retired to live in Des Moines, then came to the Mayflower Home in 1970. She was a member of the Grinnell United Church of Christ-Congregational and the Retired Teachers Association and the American Association of University Women in Cedar Rapids.

Survivors include her children, C. Montague Linkletter of Cedar Rapids and Ethel Howig of Grinnell; eight grandchildren; four great-grandchildren; and a brother, David R. Stamy of Birmingham, Mich. She was preceded in death by her husband in 1950; one son, John A. Linkletter; a sister, Cora Louise Birch; and her parents.
