Leora Lippincott, 46, of Grinnell, died early Sunday morning at a local hospital, shortly after admission.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. Tuesday from the James-Schalinske Funeral Home with the Rev. G. H. Hulsebus of Brooklyn officiating. Organ music will be by Mrs. Kathleen Heffner. In charge of flowers will be Mrs. Ray Cummings and Nellie Farley.

A lifelong resident of Malcom, with the exception of the last two years when she lived in Grinnell, she was employed as a nurses aide at Community hospital.

Born Feb. 1, 1916, at Malcom, she attended the Malcom schools and graduated from high school with the class of 1933.

On June 5, 1934, she was united in marriage with Howard Lippincott at Malcom. He preceded her in death on Jan. 17, 1960.

Mrs. Lippincott is survived by her daughter, Mrs. Edward L. (Sandra) Haugen of Victor; her grandson, Martin H. Haugen; and her mother, Lena Fogel of Malcom.

She was a member of the First Presbyterian church of Malcom.
