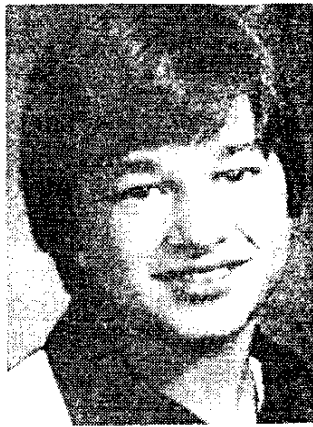

Arn Long, 17, dies in crash

Arn Long, a 17-year-old senior in the Frankfurt, Germany, American High School, was killed Sunday afternoon, Oct. 23, in a one-car accident.

He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Leland Long of Giessen, Germany, and the grandson of Hugh and Maxine Loudon of Grinnell. Mrs. Long is the former Linda Loudon.

Also surviving are two sisters, Annette, a student at Northwestern College, Orange City, who currently is studying in Paris, France, and Amy, 7.

The family is returning the body to Chapman, Kan., Mr. Long's home, for burial.

Services held for Arn Long

Funeral services for Arn Long, 17, of Frankfurt, Germany, who died Oct. 23 from injuries he sustained in an auto accident, were conducted Nov. 2 at the Chapman United Methodist Church, Chapman, Kan.

Burial was at Indian Hill Cemetery, Chapman.

He was born July 16, 1966, at Yokusuka, Japan. When he was 1, he moved with his parents to Germany where his father was a teacher. He was a student at the Frankfurt American High School at the time of his death.

He was an Eagle Scout, a member of the National Junior Honor Society, and section leader and first-chair trumpet in the concert and marching band of his high school. He also

worked as a youth counselor and was active in church activities.

Survivors include his parents, Leland and Linda Long; his grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Hugh Loudon of Grinnell; and two sisters, Annette and Amy.
