

Mrs. Losey Dies In East Hospital

Mrs. Anna M. Losey, 86, of Grinnell, passed away Thursday afternoon at Grinnell General Hospital East. She had been in poor health for several years, and had been living with her daughter, Mrs. Doris Krumm.

Mrs. Losey was the daughter of James and Julia Lowe Nichols, and was born in southern Iowa on March 7, 1833. Her family later moved to Kansas, and she attended Chillicothe Normal School in Chillicothe, Kan. Following her schooling, she taught in an Oklahoma Indian school.

On March 28, 1902, she was married to George C. Losey in Oklahoma, her one surviving daughter was born in that state. Nine years after her marriage, her husband passed away, and in 1917 she brought her daughter to Grinnell to make their home.

A Methodist, Mrs. Losey was a member of the Women's Relief Corps.

She is survived by her daughter; six grandchildren, Miss Mary M. Losey of West Lafayette, Ind., James Losey of Dayton, Ind., Mrs. Anthony (Roberta Ann) Fanning of Fresno, Cal., Miss Doris Losey of Muncie, Ind., Paul R. Krumm of New York City, and Mrs. Clark (Karen) Weaver of Grinnell. She is also survived by four great-grandchildren, a daughter-in-law, and several nieces and nephews.

Funeral services for Mrs. Anna M. Losey were held at 2:30 p.m. Saturday at the Smith Funeral Home with the Rev. J. Eugene Young, minister of the Grinnell United Methodist Church, officiating. Mrs. William Heffner was the organist.
