Earl V. Maack Former Resident, Dies In Arizona

Earl Vernon Maack, 65, a former resident of Poweshiek county, died Friday morning at Tucson, Ariz.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. Tuesday from St. John's Lutheran church here with the interim pastor, the Rev. John Pannukuk, officiating. Vocal music will be by Mrs. Noel Taylor, accompanied by Mrs. Marvin Nothnagel at the organ.

Pallbearers will be Raymond Schultz, Russell Winburn, Wayne Reams, Wesley Ahrens, Gail Young and Walter A. Barnes. Interment will be in the Trinity Lutheran cemetery with James-Schallinske Funeral Home in charge of arrangements.

The son of Louis T. and Freda Maack, he was born Aug. 5th, 1900, in the Malcom community. In early infancy he was baptized and later confirmed in the Lutheran faith at Trinity Lutheran church north of Malcom. He attended the rural schools of the community and was a graduate of Grinnell high school.

On Nov. 1st, 1922, he was united in marriage with Lucille Sukow at the Lutheran church in Marshalltown. They lived in the Grinnell community for a year following their marriage and then moved to LaPorte, Ind., where he owned and operated a commercial refrigeration business.

For the past seven years they had made their home in Tucson, Ariz., and moved there because of Mr. Maack's health.

He was a member of St. John's Lutheran church at LaPorte, Ind., and the fraternal Order of Fidels.

Survivors include his wife, Lucille; and a sister, Violet Maack of Grinnell.
