Kellogg, Ia., July 28, Special—  
Funeral services for Mrs. Carrie  
Marmon, who died at the home of  
her sister, Mrs. E. C. Turner at  
Turner early Tuesday morning of  
last week, were held at the Mad-  
sen Funeral Home Wednesday  
afternoon. Burial was made in  
our Silent City on the Pringle  
family lot.

Carrie Pringle was born in  
Sheffield, Ill. When she was about  
two years of age the family  
came to Kellogg where she has  
made her home since with the  
exception of 16 years spent in  
Monroe. She was united in  
marriage to Frank Marmon of  
Monroe at Des Moines, August 22,  
1917 and they made their home  
near Monroe until his death, May  
25, 1933. Since that time she has  
made her home with her sister.

She united with the Congrega-  
tional church here in early life  
and was a faithful and devout  
member until death claimed her.  
Her illness extended over a period  
of several months' duration. Sur-
