Mrs. Anna Marsh Rites Held Saturday

For three years she was principal of New Sharon High School and during World War II she returned to teaching and served as principal of Deep River High School for five years.

In 1915 she was married to Lew Marsh. They farmed and faised registered cattle. As a hobby, Mrs. Marsh raised Plymouth Rock chickens and entered them in shows as far away as Chicago and New York.

She was a 50-year member of the Order of Eastern Star and maintained an interest in her farms and in civic programs.

She is survived by several nieces, nephews and cousins.
