ILLNESS OF FEW HOURS.

She was united in marriage to Robert S. Mason Sept. 2, 1907. She was a faithful wife and had such a happy, friendly and lovable disposition and she had a host of friends. She never was heard to complain. Although her illness was but a few hours she was unable to resist the disease which was heart failure.
