Mr. Mathews 1982

Charles Wayne Mathews, 63, of Milden, Saskatchewan, Canada, died of an apparent heart attack Saturday morning, Nov. 6, while hunting with friends north of Ewart.

Funeral services were conducted at 10:30 a.m. Tuesday at the Smith Funeral Home, with the Rev. Daniel I. Ogata of the First United Presbyterian Church of Grinnell officiating. Organist was Barbara Lien. Pallbearers were Don Berry, Dallas Cruchelow, Glenn Cruchelow, David Goin, Arthur Iverson and Roger Iverson. Burial was at the Ivy Hill Cemetery, Malcom.

The son of Glen Wood and Margaret Beatrice Lytle Mathews, he was born Jan. 31, 1919, at Liberty, Neb. He attended the schools of Liberty and graduated from Ogallala High School in 1937.

He went to southern California to work and was married to Iona Mae Morrison on June 7, 1941, at Downey, Calif. Following their marriage they lived in the San Francisco area and at Alameda and San Leandro.

Mr. Mathews was employed at the Alameda Naval Air Station as an aircraft mechanic. Since 1968, he and his wife had operated a Canadian wheat farm near Milden and spent most of their winters at Kingsville, Texas. For the past seven years, he and his family friends had opened the pheasant season by hunting near Malcom and Ewart.

He is survived by his wife, Iona; two sons, Lloyd G. Mathews and Kenneth W. Mathews, both of Milpitas, Calif.; and five grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents.
