

Floyd Mathews

Floyd H. Mathews, 72, of Kellogg died Thursday, May 28, at Grinnell General Hospital.

Funeral services were conducted Monday at the Smith Funeral Home, with the Rev. John Epperson, pastor of the Grinnell Christian Church, officiating. Organist was Alice Renaud, and pallbearers were Frank Barr, Ray Edwards, Gordon Lewis Sr., Marvin Patterson, Harry Peterson and George Young.

Burial was in Hazelwood Cemetery.
