Retired Teacher, Mabel Maulik, Leaves Lasting Legacy

An elderly native of Victor has left the bulk of her \$600,000 estate to be split three ways among Grinnell Hospital, University Hospital and the United Church of Christ-Congregational of Grinnell.

Miss Mabel Maulik of Grinnell died Jan 5 at her Grinnell home. A retired school teacher, she directed in her Oct. 1987 will that \$3,000 be given to HLV School, several thousand to a few relatives and neighbors, and the bulk to three principal charities.

HLV has already made plans to use that bequest for an athletic field. Grinnell Hospital, which expects to receive more than \$150,000, plans to put the money in its endowment fund.

The 120-acre Maulik farm where Miss Maulik was born in 1900 was sold at an auction last week for \$171,000 to Orville Bloethe and Don Rohrer of Victor. The bulk of the estate is in what attorney Don Schild calls "conservative" investments: U.S. Treasury notes, savings bonds, government money market and gold certificates. There was also unsold grain for the farm.

The farm, which has been in the family for a century or more, has been operated by Dave Bastian of Victor.

The estate's other beneficiaries are Ruth and Arlo Worth, \$8,000; Betty Price of Brooklyn, \$1,000; Robert Price of Des Moines, \$2,000; Linda Price of Grinnell, \$2,000; Kristy Price Pifer of Grinnell, \$2,000; and \$2,000 each to Mildred Maulik Jabka, Marie Maulik Huber and Iken Maulik Bell.

The will directed that where appropriate the gifts be memorials to Mabel M. Maulik and her sister, Frances.

The HLV Community School district has received \$3000 from the Mabel Maulik estate to build a new athletic field which, according to HLV superintendent William Lynch, will be used for playing little league games. The field will be named in memory of Mabel Maulik and her sister Frances.

Mable Marie Maulik, 94, of 1018 East St., Grinnell, died Thursday, Jan. 5, at her home.

Graveside services were conducted Monday at Victor Memorial Cemetery with the Smith Funeral Home of Grinnell in charge of arrangements.

The daughter of Leon and Rosa Dusterhoft Maulik, she was born south of Victor. She attended Victor schools and graduated from Victor High School in 1919. She received her B.A. degree from the University of Iowa in 1924.

She taught history for 10 years and business administration for 30 years at Clinton, Dysart, Mt. Ayr, Montezuma and Southeast Warren community schools, retiring in 1961 to make her home with her sister in Grinnell.

She was a member of the Grinnell United Church of Christ - Congregational in Grinnell, the Iowa State Teachers Association, the Iowa Retired Teachers and National Retired Teachers associations, Epsilon Chapter at the University of Iowa Pi Omega Pi and the American Association of University Women.

There are no immediate survivors. She was preceded in death by her parents; one sister, Mary, in infancy; and a sister, Francis Maulik.

A graveside service was held Jan. 9, at Victor Cemetery, with the Rev. Bob Molsberry of United Church of Christ - Congregational, Grinnell, officiating.
