Services Here On Friday For Mrs. Glen May

A Gilman resident, Mrs. Glen F. (Bertha) May, 70, died late Tuesday afternoon at a Marshalltown hospital where she had been a patient for three days. She had been in failing health the past two years.

Services are to be held at 2 p.m. Friday from the Smith Funeral Home with the Rev. Richard Hempenius, pastor of the Newburg United Church of Christ, officiating. Organ music will be provided by Mrs. Kathleen Heffner.

The daughter of John and Caroline Selunk Cook, she was born in Hamilton, Mo., on June 13th, 1894. She attended the rural schools near the family home.

On Jan. 14th, 1914, at Kingston, Mo., she was united in marriage with Glen F. May. To this union were born eight children, seven of whom survive: Mrs. Kenneth (Nellie) Suttin of Newburg; Roy May of Idaho; Glen Lee May of Gilman; Delbert May of Lovelock, Nev.; Mrs. Aiden (Evelyn) Briggs of Columbia, S. C.; Mrs. Roger (Bougie) Mason of Marshalltown, and Dean May of Marshalltown.

One month after their marriage Mr. and Mrs. May moved from Missouri to Iowa and have since resided in the Gilman and Newburg areas.

She is survived by her husband, Glen; her seven children; 14 grandchildren; seven great grandchildren; and a sister, Mrs. Lawrence Potts of Hamilton, Mo.

Preceding her in death were her parents; one daughter, Mrs. Billie Carol Lee in 1963; two grandchildren; one brother, Karl; and a sister, Annette, who died in infancy.
