Alice Margaret Meldrem, 78, of Marengo died Friday, March 6, 1987, at the Rose Haven Nursing Home, Marengo, where she had been a resident.

She was the daughter of Seraphine and Leona Slock Bazyn and was born Sept. 11, 1908, at Belle Plaine, Iowa. She attended school at Belle Plaine. On April 16, 1935, she was married to Howard Meldrem. The couple lived in Brooklyn and Montezuma before moving to Victor in 1946. She was a homemaker while her husband operated a mill for several years and worked at Amana Refrigeration, retiring in 1979. Her husband, Howard H. Meldrem died in 1980.

She was a member of St. Bridget's Catholic Church and the Altar and Rosary Society of the Church.

Survivors include one sister: Mrs. John (Bertha Ann) DeCoster of rural Brooklyn, and two brothers: Rene Bazyn of

rural Brooklyn, and Maurice Bazyn of Victor.

She was preceded by her parents and her husband.

Funeral services were held at 11 a.m. Monday, March 9, at St. Bridget's Catholic Church, Victor, with Rev. Eugene Hoenig, pastor, officiating. Organist was Kathy Lynch of Victor who also accompanied St. Bridget's Choir.
