

Alberta K. Miller (Dolph)

Alberta K. Miller, 84, of Iowa City, formerly of Grinnell, died Wednesday, May 22, at her home.

Funeral services were conducted Saturday at the Smith Funeral Home, with the Rev. Lon L. Lewis, pastor of the Grinnell United Methodist Church, officiating. Music was provided by organist Kathleen Heffner, soloists Milton Severe and Sherry Clayton and keyboardist Janice Stewart.

The daughter of Albert J. and Edith Williams Grosenbach, she was born April 7, 1912, near Melvin, Ill. She moved with her

She taught in rural schools near Algona until her marriage to Dolph E. Miller Sept. 20, 1934. They came to Grinnell in 1937. Mrs. Miller worked in the Grinnell-Newburg schools' lunch program for 17 years, retiring in 1977. She was active in the hospital auxiliary, especially at the time when St. Francis and Grinnell General hospitals merged. She was a member of the Grinnell United Methodist Church, having been active in the choir and United Methodist Women. She moved to Iowa City in 1993 to live with her son and family.

Surviving are her son, Dale; one granddaughter; and four brothers, Emory Grosenbach of New Sharon, Gerald "Bud" and Arthur Grosenbach, both of Grinnell, and Milton Grosenbach of Gettysburg, Pa.

She was preceded in death by her parents and her husband.
