

Harry E. Miller

Harry E. Miller, 76, of Toledo, a native of rural Grinnell, died of a heart attack Tuesday, June 25, at Marshalltown Medical and Surgical Center.

Funeral services will be conducted at 10:30 a.m. Friday at the chapel of Mason-Hand Funeral Home, with the Rev. Dewey Grimes, pastor of the Assembly of God Church, officiating. Burial will be in Woodlawn Cemetery, with military rites conducted by the VFW and American Legion. Toledo

He was the son of Vernon E. and Ida G. Grovenburg Miller and was born June 20, 1920, in rural Grinnell. He attended rural schools.

On June 21, 1941, he was married to Leona Jordan in Missouri. They lived in Grinnell while Mr. Miller was employed by the M. and St. L. Railroad.

He was inducted into the U.S. Army in January 1943 and served in the Asiatic-Pacific theater. He was discharged in November 1945, then returned home and worked for the McGregor Furniture Co. for 20 years. The couple then managed a motel in Newton until April 21, 1969, when Mr. Miller became Woodlawn Cemetery sexton in Toledo. He retired in June 1992.

He was a member of the Eagles lodge in Tama-Toledo.

Surviving are his wife; one daughter, Jane "Judy" Miller of Madison, Mo.; two grandchildren; six great-grandchildren; five brothers, Harold of Des Moines, Donald of Tinley Park, Ill., Jerald and Gene, both of Newton, and Richard of Tama; and two sisters, Verna Taylor of Tama and Audrey Tycer of Wausau, Mo.

He was preceded in death by his parents and four brothers.
