Miller dies in Missouri

Ivan Clyde Miller, a former Kellogg resident, died Friday, May 26, in his Platte City, Mo., home.

Funeral services for Ivan C. Miller were held Tuesday, May 30, in Newton's Johnson-Reese Chapel. The Rev. Carl Klein, pastor of the Kellogg United Methodist Church, conducted services. Burial was in Our Silent City Cemetery in Kellogg.

Born Oct. 2, 1930 in Newton, he was the son of Clyde and Marie Tish Miller. He was a 1949 graduate of Kellogg Community High School.

He married Donna Cooper on July 2, 1953, in Kellogg. A member of the Baptist church, he served in the Air Force in Korea, and was a member of

the Naval Reserve.

At the time of his death, he had lived in Missouri for a year and a half, and before that had resided in Minnesota. He was awarded the 1975 Civil Servant of the Year award for the state of Minnesota for the year of 1975.

Surviving him are his wife, Donna; two sons, Rodney E. Miller and Craig Miller; two daughters, Sandra and Michele; a brother, Clair Miller of Kellogg; a sister, Mrs. Owen (Esther) Barr of Newton; his mother, Mrs. Marie Miller of Newton; and two grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his father, Clyde, and two brothers, Loyd and Floyd.
