George W. Milligan was born January 25, 1852, in Jefferson County, Ohio, and died at his home in the early morning of April 16, 1926, after a long and tedious illness of several years. Mr. Milligan was affiliated with the Masons and Oddfellows. By trade a stone mason he continued active at his trade until seven years ago when he was stricken and has been an invalld

to the time of his death.

Funeral services will be held from the Methodist church on Sunday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock in charge of he Rev. George Blagg. Burial will be n Hazelwood.
