Theodore Johann Christian Mithelman was born November 24, 1851, at Neubuckow in the province of Mecklenburg, Germany. A few days later he was baptized in the Evangelical Lutheran church of his native city. Here he also received instructions in the Lutheran doctrine, after which he was confirmed March 25, 1866. He was the son of John Henry and Sophia (Strickoff) Mithelman.

From Mokena Mr. and Mrs. Mithelman moved to Iowa about the year 1880, first locating at Kellogg. After making this their home for several years they moved to a farm in Sheridan township, Poweshiek county. This was their home until 16 years ago, when they moved to Malcom. Since then the latter place has been their home.

Mr. and Mrs. Mithelman's union was blessed with ten children, four of whom preceded him in death; namely Louis, who died at the age of 8 years, Elizabeth and two twins who died in infancy. He leaves to mourn his death his wife and remaining children, William, Herman and Fred of Malcom. Mrs. J. C. Schultz of Stillwater, Minn., Elmer of Malcom and George of Marine, Minn.; also eight grandchildren, Mrs. Frank Schwartz and Mrs. Howard Beaham both of Stillwater, Minn., Raymond, Leroy, Claire, Harold, Ruth and Keith Mithelman, all of Malcom; one great grandchild, Betty Jean Schwartz of Stillwater, Minn.; one sister, Mrs. Mary Lemke and one brother. Henry Mithelman, both of Grinnell. Mr. Mithelman never was very strong throughout his life; nevertheless God provided him with abundant health to provide well for his family.

About two weeks ago he became the victim of a complication of diseases. His illness steadily grew worse. On Monday morning he still parfock of the Lord's supper with members of the family. It pleased God to call his servant home on Turuesday. Nov. 5, 1929, at 12:20 p. m., at the ripe old-age of 77 years, 11 months and 12 days. Mr. Mithelman has been a faithful member of the Evangelical Lutheran church at his respective places of residence. He was a kind, loving father. He had his children brought up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord. He demanded of them that they also prove faithful members of the Lutheran church.
