—Mrs. Rhoda Stevens was born at Lyman, N. H., on the 27th of November, 1838. At the age of 18 she united with the Congregational church of which she has since been a most consistent member. In 1857 she was united in marriage with Adkins Moore who was one of the first to respond to the call for volunteers at the breaking out of the war of secession. In 1862 Mrs. Moore moved to Grinnell, her husband who was then in the army died near the close of the war in a hospital, and made her home with her sister, Mrs. E. S. Bartlett, with whom she has lived most of the time since. A son was born to Mr. and Mrs. Moore, Mr. Frank W. Moore, who now lives at Portland, Oregon. Of her brothers and sisters, Mrs. E. S. Bartlett, Mrs. Sarah Cushman and Mrs. Orrin Ferguson and Mr. M. Stevens of this city and Mr. George H. Stevens of Boston survive her. The funeral services were conducted at 2 o'clock this afternoon by the Rev. E. M. Vittum.
