## Saturday Services Conducted Here For Myrtle Moore

Funeral services for Mrs. Myrtle Moore, 86, of Akron, Ohio, a former Grinnellian, were held from the Smith Funeral Home Saturday afternoon.

Mrs. Moore died Wednesday evening at an Akron hospital following an illness of the past three years.

In charge of the services was the Rev. Chester Custer of the Grinnell Methodist church. Organ music was by Mrs. Kathleen Heffner.

Pallbearers were Terry Moore, Billie Freimuth, Oakley Ethington, Earl Esheiman, Theodore Smith, and Richard Treman. Burial was in the family plot at Hazelwood cemetery.

The daughter of David F. and Martha Chapman Miller, she was born Aug. 29, 1876, near Cambria, Iowa. Following her early education she attended Penn College, where she majored in music. She taught music until her marriage and later served as a piano accompanist on many occasions.

She was united in marriage with John H. Moore at Cambria on Dec. 24, 1898. To this union were born one son, Marcus L. Moore of Des Moines; and one daughter, Mrs. Charles Taylor of Akron, Ohio. Also surviving are two grandchildren; two great grandchildren; three brothers, H. F. Miller of Cambria, Arch A. Miller of Omaha, Neb., Jess Miller of Cambria; and two sisters, Mrs. Lulu Dotts of Corydon and Mrs. Bert (Izeal) Critchett of Des Moines.

She was preceded in death by her husband, John, on April 13, 1928; and three brothers.

Mrs. Moore lived with her husband in the Cambria and Corydon areas until 1919, when they moved to Grinnell. Following her husband's death, she moved to Des Moines in 1930. She was a member of the First Baptist church there and was active in the women's society of the church. Recently, she had moved to Akron to be near her daughter.
