

## Thomas Moore services today

Thomas M. Moore, 56, of Rte 4, Grinnell, died Thursday morning of injuries sustained in a car-train accident south of Grinnell.

Funeral services for Mr. Moore will be held at 2 p.m. today at the Grinnell United Methodist Church, with the Rev. James Russell officiating. Organist will be Mrs. Willard Heffner. Mr. Moore was active in Little League baseball as a coach and umpire and also served as president of the Grinnell Softball Association. He was a member of the Grinnell United Methodist Church.
