

9-16 OBITUARY. 1904

William Milo Morgan was born near Madrid, Neb., Nov. 2, 1888. His father was killed by accident in Nebraska some sixteen years ago, as his grandfather on his mother's side had been some eight years before that near Blue Point or Oak Grove. His sister too was killed in Utah by being thrown from a horse eight years ago. He had no memory of a father's care and could recall only a few of the earliest years with his mother. His last three years have been spent with his grandfather, Mr. Milo Morgan of our city, and during several years before he came here he had no settled home. He was a member of the South School and hoped to acquire a better education.

The boy who was the unfortunate cause of his death was as good a friend among the boys as he had. They were in the same family for some time. At his last dinner they were very merry together, yet, in the afternoon of the 9th inst., a boyish disagreement led to blows and one given him was unexpectedly fatal.

The community sympathizes very tenderly with the sad mother, the aged grandparents and all near relatives.

The funeral was at the home of the grandfather on the 11th inst., and the body was laid to rest in Hazelwood, Prof. Parker officiating.
