Forrest Marvin Morrow, 63, of rural Montezuma died suddenly on Thursday, November 20, 1997 at his home.

Funeral services were Saturday, November 22 at Watts Funeral Home in Montezuma. The Rev. John Darlington of Montezuma officiated.
