

## Rites held for John Moyer

John E. Moyer, 82, of Rte. 1, Gilman, died Sunday evening at Grinnell General Hospital. Funeral services for Mr. Moyer were held at 1:30 p.m. Wednesday at the James-Schalinske Funeral Home, with the Rev. Ralph Sarver, pastor of the Tama First Baptist Church, officiating. He was a member of the Paul Ward American Legion Post.
