Marguerite T. Munger, 84, died early Saturday morning, June 2 at Grinnell General Hospital. She was the widow of the Rev. Earle A. Munger of Grinnell's Mayflower Home.

Services for Marguerite Turner Munger will be held at 3 p.m. on Saturday, June 12, at the Mayflower Home Chapel. The Rev. Philip J. Ramstad, minister of the Grinnell United Church of Christ—Congregational, will officiate and music will be provided by Mrs. Kilburn Holt. Following cremation, her ashes will be buried in Forest Hill Cemetery in Duluth, Minn.

She was the daughter of Maynard W. and Ida Jane Dewey Turner and was born on Oct. 3, 1891 in Duluth. She attended public schools there and graduated from Stout Institute in Menomonie, Wis., in 1911. She continued her education at the University of Minnesota, and taught school on Floodwood, Minn., in Duluth, and later managed dormitories of Mankato State College, where she installed the cafeteria system.

She was a dietician at Fergus Falls State Hospital and later became music librarian at KXEL in Waterloo. She retired with her husband to the Mayflower Home in 1953. She was married to Daniel S. Murray in 1915. The couple had two children, a daughter and a son. They lived to the ages of 11 and 17 respectively. After the death of her husband, she married the Rev. Earle A. Munger on Sept. 1, 1926. He also preceded her in death on Jan 5, 1967.

She is survived by two step sons and one step daughter, R. Homer Munger of Philmath, Ore., Earle Munger of Kenosha, Wis., and Mrs. Jack E. (Margery) Sauer of Ann Arbor, Mich. Also surviving are two sisters and one brother, Mrs. J. Milton (Ida) Leadholm of Minneapolis, Minn., Mrs. T. A. (Catherine) Myers of St. Paul, Minn., and William A. Turner of Escondido, Calif. She was preceded in death by her two husbands.
