## Rites Today For A. L. McBroom, 70, Kellogg Resident

A lifelong resident of the Kellogg vicinity, Arthur Lyle McBroom, 70, died last Thursday morning at his home in that community.

Funeral services were held this afternoon (Monday) from the Kellogg Methodist church with the Rev. Lyle S. Dunham, pastor of the church, officiating. Interment was in Our Silent City cemetery at Kellogg.

The son of Franklin and Lucy Ann Starr McBroom, he was born Aug. 17th, 1891, at Laurel. He was educated at Laurel and on Aug. 1st, 1917, was united in marriage with Irene Wastier at Newton.

Mr. McBroom was an employee of the Midwest Mfg. Co. at Kellogg. He was a member of the Methodist church.

Survivors include his wife, Irene; his mother, Mrs. Lucy McBroom; two sons, Wayne of Des Moines and Carroll of Newton; and six daughters, Mrs. Paul (Lucille) O'Hara of Geinell, Mrs. Russell (Jean) O'Halloran of Victor, Mrs. Andrew (Nordine) Beaty of Akron, Ohio, Mrs. Floyd (Maxine) Purvis of Kellogg, Mrs. Robert (Patty) Hau of LaPorte City, and Mrs. Glenn (Donna) Wedemeyer of Eldora.
