Funeral services for Mrs. Sarah J. McCaw were held Thursday afternoon, August 11, at the Smith Funeral Home in Grinnell. The Rev. Helen Turner and the Rev. Ralph J. Mrs. McCaw, 86, died August 8 at Community Hospital in Grinnell. Born March 29, 1880, on a farm near Reynolds, Ill., she was the daughter of James and Anna Splan Gauley. She attended the Prairie Union school near her country home. At the age of 18 she married William J. McCaw in the Methodist parsonage at Deep River. They establish-

ed a farm home near Deep River and lived in the area for 36 years. In 1944 they moved to Chester Township, Poweshiek County, where they lived until Mr. McCaw died in 1956. Since that time Mrs. McCaw lived with her daughter and son-in-law in Grinnell. She was a member of the Chester Congregational Church and a member of the

Order of Eastern Star for nearly 50 years. Mrs. McCaw is survived by a son, Lester of Des Moines; a daughter, Mrs. Tom (Virgil) Sanders of Grinnell; three grandchildren; and one great grandchild; and one brother, Clarence E. Gauley of Davenport. She was preceded in death by her husband, her parents, three sisters and three brothers.
