Funeral Services Here Today For Miss Sadie McKee

Miss Sadie McKee, 81 of Grinnell, died at a local hospital Friday morning following a brief illness.

Services were held this afternoon (Monday) from the Smith Funeral Home. Officiating was the Rev. Charles E. Landis, pastor of the United Presbyterian church. Organ music was provided by Mrs. Eugene Holley.

Serving as pallbearers were Orville Robison, Roger Peters, Croft Pilgrim, Richard Peters, Lawrence Decatur, and Carl Child. Interment was in Hazelwood cemetery.

The daughter of Thomas and Margaret McKee, she was born January 9, 1882, near Malcom. She attended the rural schools near Malcom and was graduated from Malcom high school with the class of 1902.

That same year she moved with her family to Grinnell and was employed as a secretary for the Morrison-Ricker Glove Factory here for several years. Later, she was employed for 27 years with the Avon Products Co.

Miss McKee was a member of the Grinnell Presbyterian church and had belonged to the Rebekah Lodge, Rest and Recreation Club, and the Community Hospital Auxiliary.

She had resided at her home at 510 High St. during the summer months and spent the winters with her niece, Mrs. Earl Peters of Newton.

Survivors include two sisters: Mrs. Eugene (Agnes) Holmes and Mrs. Arthur (Darcie) Robison, both of Grinnell; one niece, Mrs. Earl Peters of Newton; two nephews, Carl Robison, presently in Germany, and Orville Robison of Des Moines; and eight grand-nieces and nephews.

She was preceded in death by her parents and one brother.
