Orville Neville rites Wednesday

Orville C. Neville, 82, rural Malcom, died Sunday morning, June 7, at his home of a heart condition.

Funeral services were held Wednesday afternoon, June 10, at Smith Funeral Home with the Rev. William Schlobohm, pastor of Malcom-Sheridan Parish, officiating. Organist was Jo Ann Schneekloth.
